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To Whom It May Concern,

I wish this letter to serve as my formal recommendation for Ann Closs-Farley. Ann is, unquestionably, one of the best costume designers working today. Period. Her work is always inventive, stylish and appropriate to the material. Her eye is extraordinary, and her people skills are second to none. I am also constantly impressed by Ann's commitment to mentorship of young designers. Ann is the total package, she is a master of creating images—working with hair, make-up, prosthetics and costume to enhance the actor's portrayal of her character. I am proud to have worked with her these past 15 years, and will not hesitate to do so in the next 15.

Ann's first show at the Actors' Gang was the sprawling musical epic EUPHORIA. EUPHORIA traced the history of man's relationship with mind-altering substances from cavemen, through the present day. The cast was large, but the number of characters they played was astronomical. There were no less than 200 characters represented on stage over the course of the evening including Vegas showgirls, anthropologists, aboriginal tribespeople, elementary school students, glamorous party goers, seedy skid row dealers and addicts. Each and every character was precisely rendered and lovingly constructed by Ann and her team. It was an astonishing feat of creativity.

And it was only the beginning.

Since then Ann has costumed at least 40 shows at the Actors' Gang, (in addition to the many shows she's designed for other companies). She has worked with our members and our guest artists and with me on shows large and small. She's designed costumes for pieces ranging from my production of MEPHISTO to Michael Sargent's PLASTICA FANTASTICA: THE BARBIE SHOW and MEDEA/ MACBETH/ CINDERELLA with Bill Rauch and the Cornerstone Ensemble. She also took charge of our extensive costume collection, receiving donations from studios and other theatres, organizing, cleaning and maintaining them for our members to use in workshops and productions.

Ann's talent is immense, but it is her personality that really sets her apart from the crowd. She is a selfless collaborator who is deeply committed to the excellence of the piece at hand. She is at ease in production meetings, flexible through technical rehearsals and can be counted on to offer constructive suggestions throughout the process. She is fearless and astute; she is the epitome of a team player. I can not recommend her highly enough.

It is my great pleasure to write a recommendation for Ann Closs-Farley. Ann served as the costume designer on two shows that I directed. TOY STORY THE MUSICAL for Walt Disney Cruise Lines and THE ROVER for USC School of Theatre. These shows were vastly different and show Ann's incredible range as a designer.

On TOY STORY the MUSICAL, Ann designed all the costumes and puppets for this multi-million dollar project, working closely with both John Lassater (Pixar) and Michael Curry (Lion King: The Musical). Her work was nothing short of phenomenal. Translating a two dimensional world is hard enough, but bringing to life these beloved characters is a true challenge, and I can honestly say the audience was awestruck by Ann's work. More importantly, Ann found a way to be faithful to the movie, but also theatrically thrilling and uniquely herself. Ann created new techniques such as printing onto fabrics for this show, and many of her innovations have now been adopted throughout Disney. She worked with an incredibly wide range of shops from Curry's vast corporation to small independent costumers, and I was continually amazed at Ann's ability to navigate the entire process while never losing her head.

THE ROVER is a restoration play with an incredibly large cast which we set in present day Naples. I asked Ann to make the world look like a Prada advertisement on a minimal budget. Working closely with the students, Ann took a collage approach to the design and created fantastic, sexy, hip and, at times, outrageous costumes which created a unique world for the play. This is what separates Ann from most designers, she is committed to both strict story telling and a creative process in the design which yields costumes that are uniquely her own. You can always spot a show that Ann has designed.

Ann is one of the top designers in the city. Her work on the 99 cent Only shows is incredible and continues to inspire countless young designers. After spending years designing for all the coolest theaters in town, she is branching out and her career is now taking her to even more high profile gigs. I know she just completed shows for Pee Wee Herman, at the Cleveland Playhouse, and the Kirk Douglas theatre. I am lucky to have her as a colleague and as a friend.
